NORTHEAST INTERCEPTOR MH13-116H TO MH13-127 REHABILITATION

The Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District will receive sealed proposals for the Northeast Interceptor MH13-116H to MH13-127 Rehabilitation. Proposals will be received at the office of the District, 1610 Moorland Road, Madison, Wisconsin 53713 until 2:00 p.m. local time on Wednesday July 2, 2014, at which time and place all proposals will be publicly opened and read aloud.

The project involves the installation of approximately 2,097 linear feet of cured-in-place liners in the Northeast Interceptor and the rehabilitation of 10 sanitary sewer manholes with an average depth of approximately 15 feet. Sewers to be lined are 48" RCP installed in 1971. In addition one manhole will be removed and replaced with a new 12' deep 6 ft x 11-1/2 ft rectangular manhole. Multiple bypass pumping systems with firm capacities of 9,000 gpm, 3,500 gpm, and 200 gpm will be required.

The liner portion of the project is located northwest of the Dane County Regional Airport near the intersection of Wheeler Road and Packers Avenue/County Hwy CV. Three of the manholes to be rehabilitated are located within the perimeter fence of the Dane County Regional Airport. No lining is required within the airport perimeter fence.

Proposals shall be addressed to the Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District; Mr. Michael Mucha, Chief Engineer and Director; 1610 Moorland Road; Madison, Wisconsin 53713; and shall be marked "Sealed Proposal, Northeast Interceptor MH13-116H to MH13-127 Rehabilitation."

A mandatory pre-bid meeting will be held at 1:00 p.m. on Wednesday, June 25, 2014 at the District office, 1610 Moorland Road, Madison, Wisconsin.

All bidders must be qualified for this specific work. All Contractors seeking to become prequalified for this type of work must provide written documentation that their personnel have adequate experience and training in the installation of CIPP. For the product to be qualified, it must have a minimum of 150,000' of successful waste water collection system installations in the USA. For the installer to be qualified, they must have at least 3 years of active experience in the commercial installation of the product. The installer must also have successfully installed at least 15,000' of 48" or larger pipe liner of the proposed product.

All prospective prime bidders must submit qualifications for review and approval by the District. Prequalification applications will be distributed with the Contract documents or can be obtained from the District. Bidders who have already submitted prequalification documentation to the District within the current calendar year need not resubmit, but must notify the District in writing by the due date (using the form provided) of their desire to prequalify for this specific work. Prequalification applications must be completed and submitted to the District office no later than 5:00 p.m., Friday, June 20, 2014. Bidders will be notified only of disqualification no later than 5:00 p.m., Tuesday, June 24, 2014. If a Bidder has not filed the prequalification application, his proposal shall not be opened.

Contract letting is subject to the provisions of Section 66.0901, Wisconsin Statutes.

All bidders are notified that all work must be performed in accordance with the minimum wage rates and other employment conditions determined for this project by the State of Wisconsin Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations.

In Connection with the performance of work under this contract, the contractor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, religion, color, handicap, sex, physical condition, developmental disability, or national origin. This provision shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff and termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The Contractor further agrees to post in conspicuous places, available for employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

Bid security in an amount equal to at least 5% of the bid amount shall accompany each Bid in Accordance with the Instructions to Bidders. The Bidder to whom a Contract is awarded shall furnish a Performance Bond and a Payment Bond each in an amount equal to the Contract Price.
