### Dear Curt:

The Village of DeForest requests MMSD approval of a service territory annexation of 121.83 acres located northwest of the interchange of Interstate 39-90-94 and U.S. Highway 51, and as mapped and described in the attached exhibit.

This request will facilitate industrial development in the annexation area. The area has been long-planned and is well-suited for industrial development on municipal utilities. It is proximate to Interstate 39-90-94 interchanges and nearby industrial development, and has excellent site suitability. The proposed annexation area includes an expanse of Interstate 39-90-94 right-of-way to connect with the current MMSD service territory to the north.

DeForest will provide this industrial area with municipal utilities. Most of the real estate is in the Village of DeForest per the attached municipal attachment ordinance and support materials, but some will remain in the Town of Burke perhaps until 2036. Municipal boundaries, the timing of boundary changes, and utility provision are as provided by intergovernmental agreements between DeForest and Burke. Pursuant to the attached CAPRC and DNR letters, the real estate within the proposed service territory annexation area was recently added to the Northern Urban Service Area.

### ORDINANCE 2023-018

AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE THE ATTACHMENT OF LANDS IDENTIFIED AS TAX PARCELS 081-0052-9340-2, 081-0052-9310-8 AND PART OF 081-0053-8420-0 FROM THE TOWN OF BURKE TO THE VILLAGE OF DEFOREST, NORTH OF DAENTL ROAD AND WEST OF 1-9094/39.

WHEREAS, the Village of DeForest entered into a cooperative agreement with the Town of Burke, City of Madison and City of Sun Prairie regarding lands that are currently in the Town of Burke and their future development; and

WHEREAS, the agreement provides for attachment of certain lands to the Village upon approval of the land owner and the Village and, in certain cases, the Town of Burke; and

WHEREAS, the owners of the property proposed for development as a warehouse/distribution facility and legally described in Exhibit A have requested attachment of said lands to the Village of DeForest; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Attachment and Revenue Sharing Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit B tentatively agreed to between the Village and Town of Burke, Burke has consented to the proposed attachment subject to the final approval of said agreement by both parties; and

WHEREAS, the DeForest Planning and Zoning Commission considered the proposed attachment and has recommended the Village Board approve the attachment; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board has determined that the proposed attachment of lands from the Town of Burke to the Village of DeForest will promote the general welfare and orderly development of the Village and/or its extraterritorial jurisdiction.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Village Board of DeForest, Wisconsin, does ordain as follows:

- This ordinance shall take effect upon final approval and execution by the Village Board and the Burke Town Board of an agreement in substantially the form of Exhibit B.
- The lands described in Exhibit A hereto are, subject to paragraph 1, attached to, and made a part of, the Village of DeForest, effective on the following dates:
  - a. The attachment of the public roadways included in the attachment description shall be effective at 12:01 a.m. on the date that is thirty (30) days after Burke provides written notice to the Village Administrator and the Village Clerk that either:
    - Burke has been awarded a STP-Local Grant from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation to construct improvements to the entire length of Daentl Road (the "Grant") – not including the Token Creek

Dear Mr. Sauser:

We have received notification, dated September 25, 2023, regarding the Village of DeForest's annexation request to the MMSD service area for the referenced properties. We are providing a determination of consistency of the proposed annexation with the adopted plans of the Regional Planning Commission in accordance with the provisions of  $\S$  200.05(4)(b), 200.11(1)(b), and 200.15, Wis. Stats.

The lands described in the MMSD annexation petition are part of the Northern Urban Service Area. A portion of the lands are part of the original Northern Urban Service Area (formerly Windsor Urban Service Area). The remaining lands were recommended for addition to the service area as part of: 1) Dane County Regional Planning Commission Resolution No. 934 on June 14, 2001 (link to document), 2) CARPC Resolution No. 2007-9 on November 29, 2007 (link to document), and 3) CARPC Water Quality Management Letter #2208 on August 10, 2023 (link to document). The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources subsequently approved these amendments to the Dane County Water Quality Management Plan in their respective letters.

Therefore, annexation to the MMSD service area would be consistent with the adopted regional plans, assuming that the conditions of approval will be met as part of the proposed development. We will inform you of the fulfillment of these conditions as part of the sewer extension review process.






### Guidelines for Orderly and Efficient Addition of Territory to the District

In the past the District has received multiple requests, over a relatively short period of time, for annexation of parcels in the same vicinity. Annexation requests have included portions of lots, or plats, and have on occasion been defined by very irregular boundaries. While special circumstances may dictate the need for such annexations, the following guidelines are intended to make the annexation process more efficient for the District and the District's customers.

- Whenever possible, proposed additions should be contiguous to existing District boundaries.
- Proposed additions should be defined to prevent gaps within the overall District boundaries
- 3. Those lands that are in the urban service area, that are part of a development plan, and which will require sewer service within the reasonably foreseeable future, should be included in the annexation request. To minimize frequent requests for small additions, the municipality requesting annexation should review its development plans prior to making the annexation request.
- 4. Whenever possible, boundaries of the proposed addition should follow the nearest established reference survey lines such as section lines, quarter-section lines, or quarter-quarter-section lines. Boundaries defined by certified surveys and/or subdivision plats should be used only when necessary to assure contiguity or to avoid gaps within the overall District boundaries. The use of irregular boundaries and/or meander lines should be avoided to minimize the opportunity for errors in descriptions and mapping.
- 5. When adjacent recreational or parklands may benefit from the sewerage service that will be provided to the territory proposed for annexation, those adjacent lands should be included in the proposed addition.

- (b) The formation of the District will promote sewerage management policies and operation and will be consistent with adopted plans of municipal, regional and state agencies; and
- (c) The formation of the District will promote the public health and welfare and will effect efficiency and economy in sewerage management, based upon current generally accepted engineering standards regarding prevention and abatement of environmental pollution and federal and state rules and policies in furtherance thereof.

3.3.4. Approval actions by the Commission under this Section shall be subject to review under Wis. Stat. ch. 227.

### Section 3.4. Costs.

### 3.4.1. Annexation Charge.

Annexations under this Chapter are subject to an "annexation charge" in such amount as the Commission may determine, to cover the cost associated with the proposed annexation. Unless the Commission determines to waive such payments, the payment of the annexation charge shall be made at such time as the Commission determines. The Commission reserves the right to adjust from time to time, the amount of the foregoing annexation charge, by resolution duly adopted by the Commission.

### 3.4.2. Annexation Fee.

Territory which is annexed to the District in accordance with the provisions of Wis. Stat. § 200.15, may be subject to reasonable requirements as to participation by newly annexed areas toward the cost of existing or proposed District facilities as the Commission may determine. Such annexation fees shall be billed to and paid by the municipality in which the added territory is located, at such time or times as the Commission may determine.

### 3.4.3. Additional Charges for Delinquent Annexations.

If the District determines that territory outside of the District is receiving service from the District, annexation of such area shall be required and the District may impose additional fees or penalties for such annexations.

### DISTRICT REGULATIONS:

District Connection Charges –
Conveyance Facility Connection Charges (CFCC) and
Treatment Plant Connection Charges (TPCC)

### 1. General Statement of Policy.

It is in the public interest for an area served by the District to bear its proportionate cost of wastewater conveyance facilities and the wastewater treatment plant facilities that serve the area. The Commission finds that this is best accomplished through a coordinated system of Conveyance Facility Connection Charges (CFCC) and Treatment Plant Connection Charges (TPCC). The District Regulations compiled here apply to both CFCC and TPCC except where otherwise indicated.

### 2. Authority.

These District Regulations were first adopted by the Commission on July 27, 2017, under the authority in District Ordinance Section 4.3.4 and Chapter 200 of the Wisconsin Statutes

For additional information regarding District Ordinances, District Regulations, District Guidance and Standard Operating Procedures, please see the District Guidance entitled What's Our Policy? and first approved by Michael Mucha, Chief Engineer and Director, on January 5, 2017.

### 3. Effective Date.

These District Regulations shall be effective January 1, 2018, as provided by law. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the provisions related to unpaid connection charges shall be enforced on a going-forward basis only.

### 4. Definitions.1

- Capital Area Regional Planning Commission (CARPC) shall mean the regional planning commission having jurisdiction over the District sewerage service area.
- Chief Engineer and Director or CED shall mean the Chief Engineer and Director of the District.
- 4.3. Commission shall mean the Commission of the District as defined and with such powers as set forth in Wis. Stat. § 200.09, as amended from time to time.

### SUBCHAPTER I

### DISTRICTS GENERALLY

- 200.01 Metropolitan sewerage districts, definitions. Unless the context requires otherwise, for the purposes of this subchapter, the following terms have the designated meanings:
- (1) "Commission" means a metropolitan sewerage district
- (2) "Department" means the department of natural resources.
- (3) "District" means a metropolitan sewerage district.
- (4) "Municipality" means town, village, city or county. History: 1971 c. 276, 307; 1999 a. 150 s. 315; Stats. 1999 s. 200.01.

200.03 Applicability. This subchapter applies to all areas of the state except those areas included in a metropolitan sewerage district created under ss. 200.21 to 200.65.

200.05 Creation. (1) Proceedings to create a district may be initiated by resolution of the governing body of any municipality

- (a) The proposed name of the district:
- (b) A general description of the territory proposed to be included in the district;
- (c) A general description of the functions which are proposed to be performed by such district:
- (d) A general description of the existing facilities and works which are proposed to be placed under jurisdiction of the district;
- (e) Such other facts and statements as are deemed by the governing body to be relevant to the standards of sub. (4) (a) to (c).
- shall immediately transmit a copy thereof to the department.
- (3) Upon receipt of the resolution, the department shall:
- municipality, providing at least 30 days' written notice of the hearing and a copy of the resolution by mail to the clerk of all affected on such date. municipalities, town sanitary or utility districts, and to the affected in the proposed district as a class 1 notice under ch. 985;

- (b) Conduct the hearing to permit any person to present any oral or written pertinent and relevant information relating to the purposes and standards of this subchapter; and
- (c) Undertake research and collect other information and request advisory reports from regional planning commissions, other state agencies and citizen groups.
- (4) Within 90 days following the hearing, the department shall either order or deny creation of the proposed district. An order creating the district shall be issued by the department if:
- (a) The territory consisting of at least one municipality in its entirety and all or part of one or more other municipalities can be identified and can be determined to be conducive to fiscal and physical management of a unified system of sanitary sewage col-
- (b) The formation of the district will promote sewerage management policies and operation and will be consistent with adopted plans of municipal, regional and state agencies; and
- (c) The formation of the district will promote the public health and welfare and will effect efficiency and economy in sewerage management, based upon current generally accepted engineering standards regarding prevention and abatement of environmental pollution and federal and state rules and policies in furtherance
- (5) An order creating the district shall state the name and boundaries of the district, which may be different than those originally proposed if each municipality affected by the district received written notice of the hearing under sub. (3) (a) and if each municipality which jointly or separately owns or operates a sewerage collection and disposal system which has territory included in the revised district boundaries has filed with the department a certified copy of a resolution of its governing body consenting to the inclusion of that territory within the revised district. No territory of a city, village or town jointly or separately owning or operating (2) A governing body which adopts a resolution under sub. (1) a sewerage collection and disposal system may be included in the district unless it has filed with the department a certified copy of a resolution of its governing body consenting to inclusion of such (a) Schedule a public hearing in the county of the petitioning territory within the proposed district. The order shall be effective on the date issued and the existence of the district shall commence
- (6) No resolution for the formation of a district encompassing regional planning commissions and state agencies; and publish an the same or substantially the same territory shall be made by any official notice of the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation municipality for one year following the issuance of an order denying the formation under this subchapter.
